IFDC Accomplishments

SMALL PROJECTS PROGRAM

The IFDC provided funding for six small projects this past year. These projects helped address forestry issues defined by the Council and included actions to mitigate these issues as outlined in the updated Illinois Forest Action Plan.

- Southern Illinois Prescribed Burn Association partnered with the Forest Restoration Support Team to update their websites so that they are better able to communicate with their members.
- Illinois Forestry Association used funding to promote the Illinois Forestry Development Act program with private forest landowners and produced a quarterly newsletter that was distributed to all IFA members.
- <u>Illinois Forestry Association</u> printed and distributed 2,500 copies of the Management of Invasive Plants and Pests of Illinois field guide.
- <u>Illinois Tree Farm</u> partnered with Illinois Walnut Council and Illinois Forestry Association to host a family forestry field day at the McCully Heritage Project located in Calhoun County.
- Shawnee RC&D printed and distributed 1,000 copies of the Illinois Forestry for the Birds pocket guide.
- The Association of Illinois Soil and Water Districts and Illinois 4-H continued their tree planting efforts in 49 Soil and Water Conservation Districts across Illinois.
